BOARD MEETNG December 10, 1873

Court House

The Board of Mayor and Aldermen of Dyersburg met at the Court House on this

Tuesday evening December 10, 1873 pursuant to a call from the Mayor.

Present Mayor Pinner, Aldermen Coker, DeBerry, McAllister, Sugg, Sampson and

Doyle.

The Mayor stated that he had called the Board together for the transaction of any

business that may be brought before the Board.

On motion the sum of Five Dollars was allowed and ordered to be paid to G. D.

McAllister for his services as Fire Warden for 1873 – all the Aldermen voting for the same

except McAllister, who did not vote and Alderman Sampson voting no.

On motion the sum of Five Dollars and 5 cents was allowed and ordered to be paid

to Wiley B. Tipton for error in his taxes for 1873 – all the Aldermen voting for the same.

W. F. Simpson complained that his property was assessed too high and asked for the

same to be reduced from \$15.00 to \$12.75 – which request was refused by the Board.

Alderman Sampson presented the following, which was unanimously adopted, to

wit:

"The Mayor and Aldermen of Dyersburg, Tennessee on behalf of the people of

Dyersburg do most earnestly protest against the location of the Depot of the Paducah and

Memphis Railroad at any other point but that on the road nearest to Dyersburg; and will

not pay either any interest on the Bonds or the Bonds themselves unless the Depot be

located as agreed upon".

It is ordered that a Certified Copy of this protest be sent to the Secretary of the

Railroad Company at Memphis by the Recorder of this Board.

Alderman Coker moved to reduce the assessment made by the Recorder for 1873 to

that made by E. C. Pate, Esy for State & County purposes or to make said assessment

conform to that made by said Pale in all cases.

This motion after being discussed was rejected – only one Alderman voting for it.

Adjourned until called by the Mayor.
