BOARD MEETING January 3, 1881 Court House

The Board of Mayor and Aldermen of Dyersburg, Tennessee met at the Court House in Dyersburg on Monday night, January 3, 1881.

Present Mayor C. P. Clark, Aldermen N. Coker, J. M. Nichols, G. E. Scott, E. S. Thurmond, C. L. Nolen and H. Parks, Jr. and W. H. Loyed, Marshall.

The minutes of last meeting were read, approved and signed.

The following accounts were then presented and on motion allowed: an account in favor of E. N. Coker for 187 ½ ft lumber used in well curbing \$2.35, an account in favor of J. R. Baker & Co. for balance due on mdse acct. \$16.90, an account in favor of W. H. Loyed for monies paid for said Corporation as per acct. filed \$36.35.

Mayor C. P. Clark reported that he had collected \$10.00 from the estate of Frank Lacy deceased (the pauper for whom allowances were made by the Board at its meeting of May 3, 1880) and that he had paid same as post payment on the pump tonight for the public well on southeast corner of the square which report was received as satisfactory.

The Finance Committee appointed at last meeting made a report which was received and filed but no action was taken on same at this meeting. N. Coker street commissioner filed a report showing that he had received \$208.00 and expended on streets \$187.30 leaving \$20.70 in his hands which he paid to H. Parks, Jr. Recorder and Treasurer. Said report was on motion adopted as satisfactory and ordered spread on the minutes which report is as follows:
