

BOARD MEETING
March 4, 1884
Court House

Board of Mayor and Aldermen for Town of Dyersburg met at Court House on Tuesday night, March 4, 1884.

Present Mayor B. L. Thomas, Aldermen J. C. Pinner, Ed Smith, A. B. Jones, W. R. Hayes and Dep. Marshal Edward Smith.

Board called to order and minutes of last meeting read, approved and signed.

On motion Privilege Tax on banks was reduced to \$40.00 per annum.

On motion R. R. committee on right of way was continued.

On motion account W. E. DeBerry for \$6.00 allowed.

On motion E. C. Pate was allowed a correct of (\$2.50) Two & 50/100 dollars on taxes of 1883.

On motion it was ordered that the Marshal of Dyersburg be invested with the same power and authority in dispersing and breaking up gambling houses and gambling – that state officers have.

On motion it was ordered that any person found guilty of disturbing parties in their usual ? ? they have paid license to the Corporation shall be fined not less than \$1.00 nor more than \$50.00 dollars.

On motion following committee was appointed to draw up an ordinance in regard to a Sunday law for controlling saloons.

On motion it was ordered that all persons owning hogs within the Corporation are required to have their marks registered with the Recorder and all hogs running at large after 30 days will be taken up if not marked and registered.

On motion inspection of beef was dispensed with for the present.

On motion it was ordered that all horses or mules found running at large on streets be taken up by Marshal and the owner of same fined not less than one dollar.
