

**BOARD MINUTES**  
**July 5, 1886**  
**Court House**

Board of Mayor and Aldermen for Town of Dyersburg met in regular session on Monday night July 5, 1886.

Present Mayor Thomas, Aldermen Smith, Sinclair, Turner, Brackin and Hayes and Marshal Smith.

Minutes of last meeting read, approved and signed.

On motion Ed Smith was continued as committee on street east of B. T. Hartons.

On motion Board was continued as committee on Depot Street.

On motion following accounts allowed, to-wit:

900 – Chess Candy Co. ----- \$5.40

On motion Jno. Sinclair, Ed Smith and Wm. Turner appointed to see Miss Sampson and Dr. Yeargin in regard to getting street opened to college building.

On motion Hayes & Watkins appointed to investigate the law in regard to setting goods on street at public outcry.

On motion committee appointed to report what was necessary on street west of Dr. McGaughey's residence, Ed Smith, Wm. Turner.

On motion following report of recorder and treasurer read:
