

**MINUTES OF THE MEETING
BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMEN
November 6, 2006**

The Board of Mayor and Aldermen met in regular session on Monday November 6, 2006 in the Municipal Courtroom at 7:00 p.m.

Mayor Revell presided with all Aldermen present.

The meeting opened with the "Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag" and prayer by Alderman Freeman Dudley.

PUBLIC HEARING – DOG ORDINANCE – ORDINANCE #BB-586

The Board held a public hearing on deleting the existing dog ordinance and replacing its entire text with a revised ordinance. Reverend Perry Middlebrook recommended that all dog owners be required to take obedience course with their dog(s) to get an ownership license within the City.

On a motion by Aldermen Kirk and Dean the Board deleted in its entirety Title 10, Chapter 2 Animal Control – Dogs and replaced it with a new section 10-201 through 10-222.

PUBLIC HEARING – BEER PERMIT

On a motion by Aldermen Lee and McCright the Board allowed a name change on a beer permit for David L. Stafford at 405 Highway 51 Bypass N. from Club Velocity to Midnight Rodeo.

RESOLUTION 110606A – 2006 PREMATURETY AWARENESS DAY

On a motion by Aldermen Dean and Lee the Board proclaimed November 14, 2006 Prematurity Awareness Day and encouraged all citizens to support the March of Dimes.

RESOLUTION 110606b – FIDP GRANT FOR NSK

On a motion by Aldermen Lee and Dean the Board approved a resolution to authorize: the construction of gas, water and sewer extensions to the north industrial park; a grant application for \$633,896 in funds from Tennessee Department of Economic and Community Development Fast Track Infrastructure Development Program (FIDP); 21% Match the grant Funds with \$168,504.00 of local funds for a total project cost of \$802,400.00

RESOLUTION 110606C – INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT FOR EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS

On a motion by Aldermen Dean and Dudley the Board approved the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement for Emergency Communications so the E-911 Board could meet all legal requirements to do grants for funding.

WATER – SEWER – GAS COMMITTEE REPORT

Chairman Lewis Norman reported on the meeting of November 2, 2006. The Committee visited two housing sites to consider complaints that water bills were excessive. At a house on the RoEllen system owned by Mr. James Mallard the Committee discovered an illegal meter turn on. The Committee instructed Water Distribution Director Steve Reed to take appropriate action. At the house at 2367 East Court it could not be determined what caused the high water use billed to owner Teddy McBride. Since both meters had been tested and read-outs were accurate, the Committee reaffirmed the City's current policy regarding payment for metered water.

MISC.

Alderman McCright inquired about the city water meter turn on policy.

Alderman Kirk was told that school funding by selling notes would be finalized in 3-4 weeks. He announced that election results will be broadcast on Channel 4 of CableOne.

Alderman Dudley inquired about payment of lot mowing fees.

Alderman Dean expressed optimism about new jobs. Commended the City employee newsletter. He announced an Airport Committee meeting November 13 at 10:00 a.m. and an Emergency Communications Board community meeting at 11:00 a.m. November 9.

Alderman Lee asked for South Main to be repaired. He urged voters to get out.

Alderman Moody encouraged voters.

Alderman Norman reported on property tax relief for the elderly and disabled.

Mayor Revell announced a traffic light for Mall Boulevard at Parr Avenue and repavement on the West end of Frank Maynard Blvd.

The meeting adjourned at 7:31 p.m.
