- WHEREAS, *Tennessee Code Annotated* 6-51-102 requires that a plan of service be adopted by the governing body of a city prior to annexing an area; and,
- WHEREAS, the Dyersburg Municipal-Regional Planning Commission has recommended that the following Plan of Service for the annexation of an area located on Radio Road (Dr. Kenneth Brunson).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF DYERSBURG, TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Pursuant to <u>Tennessee Code Annotated</u> Section 6-51-102, there is hereby adopted for the proposed annexation area the following Plan of Service:

A. Police

- (1) Patrolling, radio responses to calls, and other routine police service, using present personnel and equipment, will be provided on the effective date of annexation.
- (2) No additional personnel or equipment will be added during the first year after the effective date of annexation, but as the area develops, additional personnel and equipment will be expanded as needed.
- (3) Traffic signals, traffic signs, street markings, and other traffic control devices will be installed as the need

therefore is established by appropriate study and traffic standards.

B. <u>Fire</u>

- (1) Fire protection by the present personnel and the equipment of the fire fighting force, within the limitations of available water and distances from fire stations, will be provided on the effective date of annexation.
- (2) No additional personnel or equipment will be added during the first year after effective date of annexation, but with the growth and development of the area additional personnel and equipment will be expanded as needed.

C. Water

- (1) Water for domestic, commercial, and industrial use will be provided at the rates presently charged by the City of Dyersburg, on the effective date of annexation, and thereafter from new lines as extended by developers as development occurs in accordance with current city policy.
- (2) Water for fire protection will be available immediately following annexation and from new lines as extended in accordance with current city policy.

D. Sewer

A sanitary sewer lift station is located at the intersection of Radio road and Hwy 78. The extension of sanitary sewer lines parallel to Radio road will be the responsibility of the developers.

E. Natural Gas

The necessary natural gas lines will be installed on undeveloped property by developers as development occurs according to current city policies. Gas is currently available to existing property owners.

F. Refuse Collection

The same regular refuse collection services now provided within the city will be extended to the annexed areas after 30 days of the effective date of annexation.

G. Streets

Annexation of approximately 630 feet of street right of way will be required by this annexation. The City will provide the following services to City streets of the annexed area:

- (1) Emergency maintenance of streets. (repair of hazardous chuck holes, measures necessary for traffic flow, etc.)
- (2) Routine maintenance, on the same basis as in the present city.
- (3) Reconstruction and resurfacing of streets, installation of storm drainage facilities, construction of curbs and gutters, and other such major improvements, as need therefore is determined by the governing body, will be accomplished under current policies of the city.

H. Inspection Services

Inspection services are currently provided by the city. Code Enforcement will begin in the annexed areas on the effective date of annexation.

I. Planning and Zoning

The planning and zoning jurisdiction of the city will extend to the annexed areas on the effective date of annexation. City planning will thereafter encompass the annexed areas. The area will be zoned P-B (Planned Business) District

J. Street Lighting

Street lights will be installed by developers as development occurs in accordance with standards currently prevailing in the existing city policies.

K. Recreation

Residents of the annexed areas may use all existing recreational facilities, parks, etc. on the effective date of annexation. The same standards and policies now used in the present city will be followed in expanding the recreational program and facilities in the enlarged city.

L. Miscellaneous

(1) Street name signs where needed will be installed as new streets are opened in the annexed area.

SECTION 2. This Resolution shall be effective from and after its adoption.

The Finance Committee met at 9:30 a.m. on Tuesday, May 31, 2016 in the City Hall Second Floor Conference Room.

Committee Members Present: Mayor John Holden, Chairman Kevin Chaney, and Aldermen Terry Glover, and Bob Kirk.

Other attendees: Alderman Mike Morgan, Alderwoman Carolyn Norman, Steve Anderson, Greg Williams, Tommy Gibbons, Steve Isbell, Mark Grant, Mike Moore, Kristen Dycus, State Gazette reporter, Scott Ball, Thomas Mullins, Mike McCulloch, Mark Moody, Rodger Dudley, and Mr. and Ms. Hendren.

Chairman Chaney called the meeting to order. Ms. Hendren presented her request before the Committee asking the City to rescind its decision to discontinue mowing the north side of her property located on the corner of East Court and Everett Avenue. Ms. Hendren provided pictures of the location. She was recently notified by the City's property maintenance program regarding her grass along her ditch exceeded growth limits. Ms. Hendren stated the City had mowed the property since the City had improved the size of the ditch. Additionally, she stated the embankment created by the dredging had made the grassy area difficult to properly maintain. She stated the City should reimburse her for damage to the property and the ditch. She noted that the property next to the ditch required heavy machinery to make it conducive to mowing, and the City should incur the expense.

The Committee was provided photos of the property and they were informed by the City Street Superintendent Ms. Hendren not only owned the ditch, but property on each side of the ditch. The Committee stated there were many miles of property with similar or exact issues involving surface water draining through City or private ditches. Also, the City is required to maintain natural flow of such ditches.

Ms. Hendren stated she would prefer to have the City place culverts into the ditch at the City's expense.

Chairman Chaney concluded the discussion with a commitment to Ms. Hendren to have the committee go to the property to review the site for final recommendation.

Next on the agenda Mr. Steve Anderson provided a copy of the proposed department 2016-17 budgets. These included: Communications (EOC), Airport, Cemetery, Codes Enforcement, Police, Gas, and Meter Reading Departments. Each department supervisor presented their proposal before the Committee.

No action was taken on the proposed budgets, and the Committee scheduled to hold their review of other department budgets on Thursday, June 2, 2016, at 9:30 a.m.

With no further business the Committee adjourned at 11:30 a.m.

The Finance Committee met at 9:30 a.m. on **Thursday, June 2, 2016** in the City Hall Second Floor Conference Room.

Committee Members Present: Mayor John Holden, Chairman Kevin Chaney, and Aldermen Terry Glover, and Bob Kirk.

Other attendees: Alderman Mike Morgan, Alderwoman Carolyn Norman, Steve Anderson, Greg Williams, Kristen Dycus, and Mike Smith, State Gazette reporter, Tiffany Heard, Scott Ball, Andy Baker, Mike McCulloch, Mike Goff, Jeff Moore, John Damesworth.

Chairman Chaney called the meeting to order. Mr. Steve Anderson provided a copy of the proposed department 2016-17 budgets. These included: Water/Sewer, Wastewater, Storm water, Engineering, Street, Solid Waste, and Recreation Departments. Each department supervisor presented their proposal before the Committee.

As a result of the Street Department presentation, Street Department superintendent, Mike McCulloch requested the purchase of a replacement tractor and mowing accessory, because a tractor unit was damaged beyond repair in an accident. The budget had been submitted prior to the equipment accident and therefore had not been originally included in the proposal. The requested new equipment would replace the previous equipment. The cost would be reduced to the City, because the tractor was insured and the insurance paid approximately \$40,000.00. The City is currently attempting to use other rental equipment that is funded under the insurance policy. However, the insurance for rental is scheduled to terminate. Mr. McCulloch stated he had located new replacement equipment from a vendor under the State of Tennessee contract program. He stated the price was the best he could locate in the region. The Committee agreed the purchase was necessary and needed as soon as the equipment was available. Mr. McCulloch stated the product was currently available for immediate purchase and delivery. Alderman Bob Kirk motioned to authorize Greg Williams, Purchasing Agent, to validate the vendor as a participant in the State of Tennessee contract program, in order to buy without the City having to undergo a bid process. Mr. Williams was further authorized to bid the equipment should the vendor not be a participant in the State contract program. The motion was seconded by Alderman Terry Glover, and passed by full committee vote. The minutes and motion recommendation will be made before the full Board of Mayor and Aldermen/Alderwoman at the Monday, June 6, 2016 Board meeting.

The Committee will reconvene again in the Month of June 2016 to work toward finalizing the proposed 2016-2017 budget to be presented before the full Board of Mayor and Aldermen/Alderwoman.
